TITLE: In Support of Additional State Funding For the NYS Office for the Aging

AT THE REQUEST OF: Legislators Paul Whitford and Elisabeth Rankin:

WHEREAS, the Director of the New York State Office for the Aging has advised Chautauqua County Executive of the Governor's proposed 2019-2020 executive budget and the impact on aging services in Chautauqua County; and

WHEREAS, Chautauqua County has had a waiting list for OFA services since 2010 for in home care and adult day services causing services to be delayed up to 3 years; and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Executive and the Legislature, recognizes the value of the services provided by the county Office for the Aging that enables people to stay at home and in the community; and

WHEREAS, these services provided in partnership with local community based organizations have demonstrated their efficacy in helping older New Yorkers maintain their autonomy and independence; and

WHEREAS, such services also support families, friends, and neighbors by reducing caregiver burden/burnout: and

WHEREAS, independent research has shown that these services prevent recurrent hospitalization, emergency room visits, and are critical to a safe discharge from institutional care; and

WHEREAS, home and community based care is instrumental in preventing and delaying skilled nursing facility placement, and spend down to Medicaid; and

WHEREAS, State and Federal funds have not been able to keep pace with local needs for these services; and

WHEREAS, flexibility in service provision to meet locally determined needs is a high priority in Chautauqua County; therefore be it

KNOWN, That the Chautauqua County Legislature supports an additional 15 million dollars in the New York State Office for the Aging budget as proposed in Governor Cuomo's 2019-2010 executive budget with the intent of specifically targeting documented unmet need across New York State which will have a significant positive impact on the older adults in Chautauqua County; and be it further

MOVED, That the Clerk of the Legislature is hereby directed to forward copies of this Motion to Governor Andrew M. Cuomo, Senator Catharine Young, Assemblyman Andrew Goodell and all others deemed necessary and proper.
